

SAVE MISSION BAY GOLF COURSE FACT SHEET

OVERVIEW:	Mission Bay Golf Course: An all-inclusive 18-hole Executive Golf Course located in San Diego, designed over 65 years ago by Ted Robinson. This course is uniquely suited for golfers of all ages and skill levels, making it an ideal destination for youth, senior, beginner, and avid golfers alike, providing an accessible and enjoyable golfing experience for all.
COURSE FEATURES:	 Amenities: Includes a 40-station driving range, a new 5,000 sq. ft. clubhouse, and pro shop. Nighttime Play: The only golf course in San Diego with lighting for night play. Executive Course: Measuring 2,719 yards on 46 acres where most golf courses require 75-100 acres.
COMMUNITY/ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT	 Supports youth golf development with summer camps, San Diego Junior Golf Association, and Junior World. Provides senior golf, foot and frisbee golf, and a women's golf club. Golf is a critical component of San Diego's economy, especially related to tourism. A front-end pipeline to larger golf courses, i.e., Torrey Pines, Balboa and other popular facilities that provide active recreation to thousands of San Diego residents. Environmental Impact: Turf grass acts as a pollutant filter, mitigates flooding, and provides wildlife habitat. Uses smart irrigation and recycled water to conserve water resources. Plans for electric and battery-operated equipment by 2030 to reduce emissions and noise pollution.
	 Protects and provides a significant habitat supportive of bird life, and a substantial buffer from Sea Level rise by being 3' above the adjacent Bay.

	 The golf course's tree canopies and 46 acres of turf grass have been sequestering Carbon and greenhouse gases from the nearby streets and freeway for over 65 years.
USAGE AND POPULARITY	 Annual Visitors: Over 150,000 players annually (over 400/day) and 80% of the usage is from City of San Diego residents. One Course For All: Ideal for younger and older golfers due to its short length, walkability, and affordability.
	 High School Involvement: 20 local high schools use the course for practices and matches, supporting over 400 students/per year in golf development.
	More Revenue: Increases projected with facility's new wedding and outdoor amenity improvements.

CONCLUSION	MBGC provides affordable and accessible municipal golf services to the public. Municipal golf

	reflects diversity in California through gender, ethnicity, lifestyle, and economic status.
CONCLUSION (Continued)	The \$13.6 million investment in the current Mission Bay Clubhouse and infrastructure improvements comes directly from green fees and is managed by the City's Golf Division. This is NOT public money.
	MBGC is an historic City treasure, contributing services to thousands of tourists, youth, seniors, and revenue to the City's General Fund. Any reduction would be catastrophic to active recreation of Mission Bay, its stakeholders, and the game of golf.
	We urge that the City of San Diego recognize the societal, environmental, and recreational benefits that MBGC brings to our community; and how vital it is in providing affordable and accessible public golf and active recreation for the thousands of citizens and tourists of San Diego.
